MONDAY, FEBRUARY 2–THURSDAY, FEBRUARY 5, 2015

8am–5pm: BASIC PROBLEM GAMBLING COUNSELOR TRAINING

(8am–3pm on Thursday)

Presented by: Oblio Stroyman, M.Ed, LMFT, QMHP, CGAC-II, NCGC-II, BACC, and Colin Hodgen, MA, LADC-S, CPGC-S, NCGC-II This 30-hour workshop serves as an introduction to problem and pathological gambling disorders. Participants will learn about the scope and prevalence of gambling and problem gambling on a national scale, risk factors, and how the increased availability of gambling over the past 10 years has affected the prevalence of gambling problems in the United States. The DSM-5 criteria for pathological gambling will be discussed, and participants will learn practical application of the most commonly used screening and diagnostic tools. This workshop outlines the types and sub-types of gamblers and several approaches to treatment of problem gamblers. Participants will learn about the disorders that most often co-occur with problem gambling and the effects of the disorder on family and loved ones. Basic Training also includes an overview of topic areas covered on the National Counselor Certification Exam. Basic Problem Gambling Counselor Training is required for Washington State Gambling Counselor Certification.

MONDAY, FEBRUARY 2, 2015–ADVANCED WORKSHOP

8-10am: HOMECOMING: HOW TO HAVE A THERAPEUTIC CONVERSATION WITH TODAY'S VETERAN/MILITARY PERSONNEL **AROUND MENTAL HEALTH AND ADDICTIONS ISSUES**

This session will review the addiction and mental health issues facing our returning veterans and offer suggestions to clinicians in ways to engage this population for further treatment. Participants will learn motivational enhancement strategies that will be effective when working with veteran/millitary populations.

Group therapy is a powerful therapeutic tool for treating addictions. It is suitable especially for treating problems that commonly accompany addiction, such as depression, isolation, and shame. What are the best recruitment methods? What factors are involved in group formation? Learn more about this and how to improve skills for building group safety and support, cohesion, and longevity.

ADVANCED CLINICAL SKILLS 8am–3pm

Participants will discuss ongoing evaluation and placement, follow-up on treatment plans, involving the family in the treatment process, coordinating care with other community members and referral sources, case consultation with legal and other professionals, and financial issues including budgeting and marital issues around spending.

SUCCESSFUL RECORDS MANAGEMENT 3-5pm:

Presented by: Cheryl Wilcox and Maureen Greeley

Record keeping is a real part of every counselor's job. This session will clarify what the requirements are for state- and ECPG-funded providers, and will provide tools to further your success. We will walk through a new client record from assessment to discharge and answer any guestions you may have regarding Washington State WAC requirements and counselor responsibilities in record keeping and billing.

MAUREEN GREELEY

Maureen Greeley has served as Executive Director of the Evergreen Council on Problem Gambling since November 2006, helping to broaden the Council's reach and strengthen its programs and services. She is currently the President of the National Council on Problem Gambling's Board of Directors. She has worked with and for the state and National Councils since 1998.

COLIN HODGEN, LADC-S, CPGC-S, NCGC-II

Colin Hodgen has a master's degree in Counseling and Educational Psychology (University of Nevada, Reno) with an emphasis in Addictions. He is a Nevada-licensed alcohol and drug counselor, and a Nevada-certified problem gambling counselor and supervisor. He has experience in psychoeducation and the screening, assessment, and placement of individuals with addictive disorders. Hodgen wrote and teaches an online course in aging and addictions for the University of Nevada, Reno, and is co-author of *Gambling Patient Placement Criteria*.

TY LOSTUTTER, PhD

Ty Lostutter is an Assistant Professor at the Center for the Study of Health and Risk Behaviors in the Department of Psychiatry and Behavioral Sciences at the UW. Dr. Lostutter has more than a decade of experience conducting clinical research and prevention of disordered gambling. He received his PhD in Clinical Psychology from the UW in 2009. Dr. Lostutter joined the Board of the Evergreen Council in 2007 and currently serves as Vice-President; he also serves on the Board of the National Council on Problem Gambling.

DENISE QUIRK, MA, MFT, LADC, NCGC-II, CPGC-S

Denise Quirk is certified as a clinical supervisor and gambling counselor

specializing in treatment for families. She is the CEO and Clinical Director of the Reno Problem Gambling Center, a non-profit outpatient treatment center. Denise created and teaches an online problem gambling course through the University of Nevada, Reno. She serves as a Board member for the Nevada Council on Problem Gambling and is a member of the Nevada Governor's Advisory Committee on Problem Gambling. She is co-author of *Gambling Patient Placement Criteria*.

ABBY SMITH, NCC, LMHC, CDP

Abby Smith received her MA in Psychology with an emphasis in Mental Health Counseling from Antioch University, Seattle, in 1998. She has been a counselor in substance abuse and mental health for more than 25 years. Abby has taught at Edmonds Community College for 10 years, and was also an adjunct faculty at Antioch University, Seattle.
