

TRAINING WORKSHOP SCHEDULE

MONDAY, JULY 25 - THURSDAY, JULY 28, 2016 - INTRODUCTORY TRAINING

8 am - 5 pm INTRODUCTORY PROBLEM GAMBLING COUNSELOR TRAINING

Presented by: Loreen Rugle, PhD, NCGC-II

This 30-hour workshop serves as an introduction to problem and pathological gambling disorders. Participants will learn about the scope and prevalence of gambling and problem gambling on a national scale, risk factors, and how the increased availability of gambling over the past 10 years has affected the prevalence of gambling problems in the United States. The DSM-5 criteria for pathological gambling will be discussed, and participants will learn practical application of the most commonly used screening and diagnostic tools. This workshop outlines the types and sub-types of gamblers, and several approaches to treatment of problem gamblers. Participants will learn about the disorders that most often co-occur with problem gambling, and the effects of the disorder on family and loved ones. Introductory Training also includes an overview of topic areas covered on the National Counselor Certification Exam. Introductory Problem Gambling Counselor Training is required for Washington State Gambling Counselor Certification.

WEDNESDAY, JULY 27, 2016 - ADVANCED WORKSHOPS

8 am - Noon UNDERSTANDING AND TREATING PSYCHOLOGICAL TRAUMA AND ADDICTIVE DISORDERS (4 CEU)

Presented by: Oscar Sida, MS, NCC, LCPC, LCADC, CPGC

This training session is designed to provide a clinical understanding of the effects of trauma and how they are interrelated to the etymology of addiction disorders and treatment implications. Emphasis will be placed on approaches to treatment. In addition, the diagnostic criteria for various trauma categories and appropriate treatment approaches will be explored.

1 pm - 5 pm APPLYING MOTIVATIONAL INTERVIEWING TECHNIQUES WITH ADDICTIVE DISORDERS (4 CEU)

Presented by: Oscar Sida, MS, NCC, LCPC, LCADC, CPGC

Participants will take a journey into the history of mindfulness and how it has become an important psychological approach today. This session will discuss how mindfulness can be used to address addiction, and participants will learn how to practice mindfulness with some basic techniques. Non-traditional and promising practices will also be discussed.

THURSDAY, JULY 28, 2016 - ADVANCED WORKSHOPS

8 am - Noon THE HEALING POWER OF RITUAL (4 CEU)

Presented by: Alan Basham, MA

This session will discuss aspects of integrating client spirituality into the healing process of counseling, and review the competencies for spiritual integration developed by recognized leaders on the topic. Thoughtful consideration and experience of several of these helpful spiritual practices in counseling will be discussed, with an emphasis on the development of personally meaningful ritual to aid in resolution of emotional pain.

1 pm - 3 pm SELF CARE FOR THE TREATMENT PROVIDER (2 CEU)

Presented by: Alan Basham, MA, and Ryan Kiely, MS, LMHC

During this session, participants will address the adverse effects of stress, and obtain knowledge of appropriate boundaries as a means of health care. Participants will also gain a new or deeper awareness of the importance of nature in self care.

1 pm - 3 pm NATIONAL PROBLEM GAMBLING COUNSELOR TEST PREP ** AND CERTIFICATION INFORMATION (2 CEU)

Presented by: Loreen Rugle, PhD, NCGC-II

To become a Certified Problem Gambling Counselor (nationally or in Washington State), treatment providers must pass the International Certification Examination for Gambling Counselors (previously National Certification Exam). This workshop will offer a review of the outline of gambling-specific topics that are covered on the national exam and discussion of such topics as prevalence, criteria, assessment, treatment strategies, neurochemistry, psychopharmacology, and gambling and the law. Includes sample test questions offered in a pre/post format with discussion.

Oscar Sida is a bilingual mental health and addictions counselor from Las Vegas, Nevada. He serves as program coordinator and faculty in the College of Education and Clinical Studies at the University of Nevada Las Vegas, where he teaches courses in mental health counseling, human services, and assessment and treatment of addiction disorders. He also works as a clinical supervisor for counseling interns at The Practice at UNLV, a Community Mental Health Agency. Oscar specializes in process addictions and psychological trauma. He has been featured in print media, television, and film for his expertise in the area of pathological gambling and addictions, and has presented as a speaker for regional and national conferences. He holds a Master of Science degree in Clinical Mental Health Counseling and a Bachelor of Science in Psychology, both from UNLV.
